Schedule:

The retreat is structured with necessary breaks. Participants should feel relaxed and happy, making their unique shawl.

- 1st day: 2 p.m. to about 9 p.m.
- 2nd day: 10 a.m. to about 9 p.m.
- 3rd day: 10 a.m. to about 2 p.m.

Clover locking stitch markers, printed instructions, and a guide sheet with terminology will be provided.

Supply List:

2 - 60" circular needles, in the proper size for yarn selection **-or-**

1 - 60" circular needle and a long cable with two end caps like KnitPicks brand

DK weight yarn: e.g. 200 g DK variegated yarn with long color runs and 200 g matching solid (300m/100g), and US5 needles **-or-**

Worsted weight yarn: e.g. 250 g Worsted weight variegated yarn with long color runs, 150 g matching solid yarn (200m/100g), and US8 needles.

Lonesome Stone Natural Fiber Mill and Alpacas is located in a beautiful, rustic setting nestled between Grand Lake and the Sol Vista ski area. The entrance to Rocky Mountain National Park is just minutes away to the majestic park full of breath-taking vistas and abundant wildlife.

Lonesome Stone is a working, alpaca farm and natural fiber mill with approximately 180 alpacas on premises. The mill processes natural fiber only into the most luxurious yarns. A tour of the fiber mill will give the knitter a better understanding of how yarn is produced - beginning with touching the fiber on the alpaca to the finished product on the shelves of the store. Lonesome Stone has quite an array of single and blended natural fibers. Linda, the owner, also offers stunning, hand painted yarns.

The closest, major airport is Denver where flights can be conveniently scheduled. Travel from the airport to Granby is approximately 1 1/2 to 2 hours by car crossing over Berthoud Pass, Winter Park, and Mary Jane ski areas - a beautiful drive. Perhaps at this time of year, the Aspen trees will be turning into a golden blaze.
